Energy Fuels Resources' White Mesa Uranium Mill is the last conventional uranium mill in the United States and is located next to the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe's White Mesa community and is close to Bears Ears National Monument in southern Utah. The mill has accepted large amounts of uranium-bearing mineral wastes from the U.S. and foreign countries and is turning into an international radioactive waste dump. Now Energy Fuels' uranium mine in La Sal and their Pinyon Plain mine near the Grand Canyon are sending large amounts of uranium ore to White Mesa.

The mill was built on top of dozens of ancient and culturally significant sites. Numerous cultural sites including pit houses, kivas, and burial sites were destroyed and desecrated when the mill when the tailings cells (impoundments) were built. The mill has plans to expand with four more impoundments for liquid and solid wastes, which would further destroy significant cultural sites and increase the environmental and health threat to the White Mesa Community. Today, the mill processes conventional uranium ore, uranium bearing wastes from other mineral processing operations, and monazite sands to recover uranium and rare earth elements.

Join with the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, White Mesa Concerned Community, Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice, Uranium Watch and other allies to oppose radioactive waste shipments and disposal at the Energy Fuels' facility – and to oppose Energy Fuels' uranium mines at La Sal and near the Grand Canyon.
